

I am happy to announce that the Animal Welfare League is celebrating their 90th Anniversary. We are issuing this Special Edition newsletter to share just a few of the events that have transpired over the years. We have weathered many storms in the animal industry and have always come out on top for the sake of the animals. We would like to take you on a trip down memory lane.

Ninety years is a long time and so much has occurred over the years. We survived Covid and watched the turn of the century as we entered the new millennium. Quite an experience for all of us! We have advocated for laws to become more favorable for animals.

Animal cruelty and abuse will no longer be tolerated in many states. AWL has always been involved in pursuing legislation to enhance the betterment of animals. We are active in educating and promoting spay/neuter. Pet over-population has decreased due to public awareness and programs that we sponsored over the years. We have assisted in many natural disasters such as floods, hurricanes and even hoarding situations.

We still maintain two separate buildings. One located in Chicago that has been there since 1935 and is now being used as an intake and/or holding facility. The other building is located in the southwest suburb of Chicago Ridge. We are able to house hundreds of animals which otherwise would have had nowhere to go. Many of the animals were victims of gunshots, fires, hit by cars, dog fighting survivors and so much more. We have a full time veterinarian that provides excellent care to all of the animals in our possession.

We do our very best to give back to many communities by providing low cost veterinarian services to those in need. Our goal is to help others keep their pets and maintain their health.

Without us, there would be hundreds upon thousands of animals that may not have survived. Thousands of animals have received a good forever loving home. The key to success is to provide love, care, understanding, compassion and the willingness to change with the times. Over the past few years, our new motto is "Where Would They Be Without Us?" I am proud to serve as the President of the Animal Welfare League and will continue to do everything in my power to make sure all animals receive the care they deserve. We thank each and every one of our supporters from the bottom of our heart for allowing this happen. We would never have been able to achieve these goals without you. Thank you for everything!

Diane Celebrating 50 Years

Diane celebrated 50 years of employment with the Animal Welfare League, located at 6224 South Wabash Avenue, Chicago, Illinois. This has been Diane's one and only job. She has dedicated her entire life to caring for animals. Diane started out as a young girl working at the shelter. Over the years, she has seen it all. Diane has been shot at, threatened, vandalized and so much more. However, that has not stopped her from following her heart and caring for animals. Diane has been managing the Wabash animal shelter for years. She has cared for thousands of animals and wears many hats. She has a wildlife license and her specialty is squirrels. She has nursed hundreds of them back to health. People drive hours just to bring them to her, injured, sick, orphaned, etc. Diane is also a licensed Approved Humane Investigator by the Department of Agriculture. She has been on hundreds of animal cruelty com-

plaints, many animal raids, hoarding situations, animals trapped in buildings, trapped on the ice in the lake, injured in traps, left behind in vacant buildings, abandoned and tied up in front of the building waiting for her to arrive in the morning. In addition to her extensive experience with wildlife, she has had the pleasure of assisting exotic animals such as lions and monkeys, farm animals including sheep and pigs, and so much more. Many of the animals would not be alive today, if it were not for her dedication and many years of expertise in the industry. Nothing stops Diane from going to work daily. Not even snow storms, tornadoes, ice storms, power outages, road closures and so much more. She has driven the same route for 50 years. Her dedication and compassion are unmeasurable. Diane's heart and soul makes her a one of a kind. The Animal Welfare League is proud to have Diane as an employee and looks forward to many more years. Kudos to Diane!

Yoshi came to AWL back in 2012. He was a 5 month old Yorkshire Terrier pup. He was an owner give up because he was badly injured and they no longer wanted him. Yoshi, being a normal rambunctious puppy would jump on his owners out of excitement. The owner used a broomstick to train him and hit him across his back to teach him to stay down. Unfortunately, they hit him so hard and shattered a section of his spinal column. Yoshi became paralyzed and could no longer use his back legs. The medical staff at AWL tried everything. He received xrays, ultrasounds, special medication, cage rest, medical wraps, braces, casts, etc. None of the treatments and procedures worked. After several long months of trying everything possible, he was officially deemed permanently paralyzed. A volunteer took a special interest in Yoshi and wanted to foster him. She took



him to water therapy and saw several specialists but it was always the same ending. Yoshi was permanently paralyzed. However, the volunteer did not see a disabled dog. She saw a dog full of life and decided to adopt Yoshi. Yoshi went to his forever home and was a bundle of joy. He got a custom made wheel chair and his fun had just begun. He would buzz around the house, chasing toys, balls, stealing things, chewing, barking, begging and just being an actual puppy. He loved being with other dogs, all sizes and breeds. His favorite past time was playing in his yard and chasing the sunshine.

Yoshi needed two baths daily due to his disability, loved to play in the water and would even roll around in his bed filled with blankets to dry off, just like any other typical dog would do. He did require more frequent haircuts to keep him sanitary and definitely needed extra love and kisses. Yoshi never noticed that he was different and was just so happy.

On March 13th of 2025, Yoshi celebrated his 13th Birthday. It is hard to believe how quickly the years have gone by. As Yoshi grew older, his body began to fail him. He developed kidney disease and then went into kidney failure. At the end, he needed regular I.V.s to maintain his fluid level but was such a trooper.

We lost our beloved Yoshi on March 29, 2025. The angels came for him and took him away to heaven. His mother and father told him how special he was, how beautiful heaven was going to look and sang his favorite song to him. We held him tight against our chest so he could feel our heartbeat until he took his last breath. We hope Yoshi is looking down on us, running around without his wheels and just being a happy dog.

We encourage you to adopt a special needs pet. Yes, they may require a little extra love and care. The amount of love they can bring to you is unmeasurable. There are so many animals in shelters that may need to take medications, follow a special diet, have some type of disability or are simply just seniors that need a forever home. Please consider opening your home to a special needs pet. If it were not for the Animal Welfare League, Yoshi would have never received the chance at living a full loving life.

In 1935 in a rented office located in the Chicago Loop, a small group of animal advocates got together to aid the South Side's homeless animals. On September 30, 1935, the Illinois Citizens' Animal Welfare League was officially established, and for the next three years, its founders fundraised to rent its first location: a converted two-car garage at 4807 South Wabash Avenue. In 1938, it was revealed that one of Chicago's municipal shelters had been providing thousands of animals to local universities for experimental purposes. Spurred into action, our founders increased their efforts to help the homeless animals and quickly outgrew the tiny shelter they started in. In 1942, our new location at 6224 South Wabash Avenue was opened to the public, offering adoptions and other humane care to the community.


The Animal Welfare League began serving more and more municipalities as our humane services became well-known throughout the South Side communities. The League engaged in rescue operations for all sorts of animals in need, from abandoned dogs and kittens trapped inside of walls or fences, to horses, orphaned squirrels, rabbits, even raccoons. Animals that were neglected or abused, abandoned or sick; as the needs of Chicago's animals grew, so too did the League. Over the next several decades, there were expansions to our Wabash shelter, a fleet of trucks and even a boat, spaying and neutering services and adopting out thousands of animals. In 1974, as a response to the growing need of the south suburbs, the League opened a second location at 10101 South Ridgeland Avenue in Chicago Ridge. The League eventually outgrew that location and in 1992, opened a brand new location at 10305 Southwest Highway in a state-of-the-art building, becoming one of the largest animal shelters in the state of Illinois.

From our founding on September 30, 1935 to the present day, the Animal Welfare League continues to provide humane care to homeless animals in need and service a multitude of communities with our Low Cost Clinic at our Chicago Ridge location. From our founding president, Ms. Wildred Fitz-Hugh, to current president Chris Higens, the League will always strive to help the animals who need it the most. It is our love for the animals that will drive us forward into the future.





THROUGHOUT THE YEARS





Providing Care in



Mercy is a terrier mix that came into our shelter clinging to life. She apparently was attacked by another animal and left in a ditch barely breathing. Our Chief Veterinarian, Dr. Paul, and his medical team guickly went into trauma mode and performed life saving treatments. This little terrier had puncture marks and was ripped open on both sides of her body, including her head and face. She was rushed into surgery and put back together. Her spleen was so enlarged from the trauma which she endured, that she could not even lay down comfortably. We used blankets, pillows and beds to prop her up so she could rest her tired body along the wall of the cage. Mercy's condition was so critical, our staff watched over her 24 hours a day. We would cry and pray for her. We even asked God to please help this little girl and to have "Mercy" on her.

When we would say the word "Mercy", she would lift her little head and stare into our eyes. We knew at that moment, she was a true miracle and named her "Mercy." As time went by, Mercy began to show improvement. Although it was a long and slow recovery, we are happy to report that Mercy is now a happy and healthy little girl. She loves other animals and plays with her toys! If it were not for the Animal Welfare League, this little girl most likely would not be here today. She is just one example of the many lives saved at the shelter.

The Animal Welfare League cares for many animals with special needs. These cases are ones that require long-term care and medical support in order to live comfortably.


